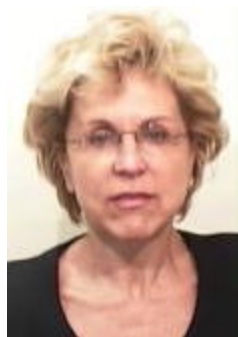

He was the Bank-wide coordinator for City Development Strategies (CDS), a new analytical tool focusing on cities as the unit of analysis in national development. In addition to many policy papers on decentralization, Mr. Campbell has authored several books. "The Quiet Revolution," explores the rise of political participation in cities with the rise of decentralization in Latin America from 1983-1995 (University of Pittsburgh Press, 2003). A second book "Leadership and Innovation" (World Bank Institute, 2003) is a collection of case studies of leading local governments in Latin America. He holds a B.A. in Political Science from U. C. Berkeley (1966), a Master's in City and Regional Planning from U.C. Berkeley (1970) and a Ph.D. in Urban Studies and Planning from M.I.T. (1980).

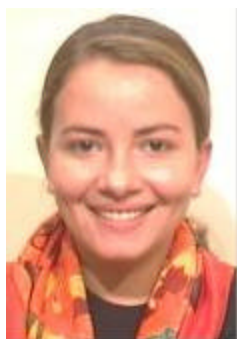
